Brianne Koch

FOLL: What neighborhood do you live in?

Brianne: Kentfield

FOLL: Your family?

Brianne: We have an 11 year old daughter, an 8 year old son.

FOLL: Pets?

Brianne: A very fluffy cat named Mae.

FOLL: What is your job?

Brianne: Since moving to Marin in 2017, I've taken a hiatus from working out of the home. Prior to that, I worked for the Drug Enforcement Administration as an Intelligence Analyst for about 11 years.

FOLL: Why work with the Friends? Why the library?

Brianne: I am so excited to help with Friends of Larkspur Library. Libraries are so important to our community, and provide information, entertainment, and a place of belonging.

FOLL: Where else do you volunteer/have you volunteered?

Brianne: I have always made it a priority to volunteer at my children's schools. I've also served on the board of Pixie Park, and also volunteer with SFJazz.

FOLL: Who is the biggest user of the library in your family?

Brianne: I am! And I love searching the shelves for new reads for my kids.

FOLL: How do you find new books? For kids? You?

Brianne: GoodReads, my sisters and mom, and talking with librarians.

FOLL: What are some of your favorite libraries in your life? Where and why?

Brianne: My childhood library (Whitmore Library in Cottonwood Heights, Utah) because of all of the memories it holds. My mother and I used to spend hours there.

FOLL: Is Larkspur Library your children's first library?

Brianne: Yes! Larkspur Library was the first library we visited when we moved to Marin.

FOLL: What would be your dream feature(s) for the new library? Cafe? Art gallery?

Brianne: Local coffee shop, maker space/community space for kids and teens.

FOLL: What neighborhood do you live in?

Lisa: I live in Corte Madera now, but raised my children in Greenbrae for 18 years, and I grew up in Mill Valley.

FOLL: Your family?

Lisa: I have two grown children, Rebekah and Joshua. Rebekah is 27 years old and Joshua is 23 years old. My parents currently live in Greenbrae and moved back years ago to be near their children and grandchildren. I am divorced after 22 years of marriage and currently re-married to a wonderful man for five years.

FOLL: Pets?

Lisa: I love animals. I have a 2 year old dog, Stinson (yes after the beach--my happy place) who is sitting at my feet right now. He is actually a Facility Dog and comes to school with me 3 times a week and he spends his time having children read to him. He also gives Deep Pressure Therapy to my middle school students for anxiety. My dream was to always have a reading dog, and the past two years I have trained Stinson to be a reading dog. He also comes with me to several public libraries as well. Maybe our next stop will be the Larkspur Library.

FOLL: What is your job?

Lisa: I'm a Teacher Librarian at Mt. Tamalpais School (a private K-8 school in Mill Valley). I began my career as a teacher and went back to school when my kids were young to get my MLIS in Library and Information Science

at SJSU. I graduated with my MLIS in 2010.

FOLL: Why work with the Friends? Why the library?

Lisa: I love libraries as you can imagine, and that is my job. I was approached by board member Dulcy Brainard for the position and it sounded very interesting and exciting with a new library, and I wanted to be a part of the new library. I always thought the Larkspur Library was very eclectic and quaint, but small and hard to get to.

Lisa: I volunteer a lot. Probably too much. Before this, as a parent I volunteered at my kids' school doing everything from newsletters to being the Parent Association president. I volunteered coaching for Girls on the Run, an organization to encourage girls to run and move their bodies. For the past three years I volunteer at Rodef Sholom for the Bag Lunch Program at St. Vincent's, making bag lunches for those in need.

FOLL: Who is the biggest user of the library in your family?

Lisa: Me, of course, next would probably be my mom.

FOLL: How do you find new books? For kids? You?

Lisa: It's my job. I spend time reading journals and then checking the books out of the library before determining what to purchase for my library at MTS. I rarely buy myself books, as I always use the library. But occasionally there is a book that I must have for my own library at home

FOLL: What are some of your favorite libraries in your life? Where and why?

Lisa: The Mill Valley Public Library was where I grew up, the Mill Valley Middle School Library was also my happy place too. Now I tend to spend more my time at the Corte Madera library because of the vicinity and size of the children's room, and it was easier to park when I took my children. Libraries in colleges were also my favorite places too: the USC library, The Doheny Library, is amazing and beautiful. I spent a lot of time there when visiting my daughter when she was in college. When I travel now, I want to start visiting different libraries. I plan on visiting a library in Chicago when I go in June to visit my son; I heard the architecture at the University of Chicago Library is something to see.

FOLL: What would be your dream feature(s) for the new library? Cafe? Art gallery?

Lisa: Why can't we have a little bit of both as a Cafe and art gallery?




