# Among Friends Fall 2024



Dear Library Patrons,

It's exciting to look ahead to the completion of the new Larkspur Library in early 2026, but today I wanted to look back at what we like to think of as the origin of Friends of Larkspur Library. The Larkspur Women's Improvement Club was a group of 29 women who first

gathered in 1912 to make Larkspur a better place to live. They started with cleaning up our streets by financing the first 24 trash cans in Larkspur and weekly trash collection service. They made their political voices heard by supporting the construction of our proposed city hall, which opened in 1913, then lobbied for a free library, which opened soon after in a small corner of the city hall with 265 books. The Women's Improvement Club supported the library much like we do today with fundraising and events.

When the fire department moved out of town hall in 1939, the library moved into the vacated space, where it has been ever since. The Larkspur Library collection has grown from 265 books to over 50,000 free books, plus DVDs, CDs, e-books, computers, games, and seeds. And now, 111 years later, here we are, still loving our library! Thank you, as always, for your support.



### Mobile Home Park Laundromat Library

Friends of Larkspur Library is pleased to announce that we have set up another children's laundromat library, bringing our total to three. The first two are in Larkspur at the two iDoLaundry locations (469 Magnolia Avenue and 594 Magnolia Avenue).

This new collection of free children's books is at the **Marin RV Park laundromat in Greenbrae** (2140 Redwood Hwy). We put free children's books in laundromats because they are safe, well-lit, and temperature-controlled spaces. Parents generally return weekly and their children often wait an average of 90 minutes as the family laundry is washed, dried, and folded. Offering a selection of books for kids is an engaging alternative to boredom or electronic games. If they choose to take the books home, we're pleased to know home libraries are being built.

Our board members happily restock the libraries every two weeks with donated new or gently used children's books.
